Have you ever looked up at the sky at night and wondered how many stars there are? Throughout history people have used the stars in many different ways, from 21 to telling stories that pass down traditions and culture. Less than 100 years ago, it was usual to see a clear and starry night sky. Unfortunately, now millions of people around the world are unable to see the Milky Way, including nearly 80 percent of North Americans. The reason for this is light pollution, which affects 99 percent of the continental United States and Europe.

Most people are aware of the consequences of air, water, and land pollution, but light is also a pollutant that has numerous negative 22. Despite not being as immediately noticeable or harmful to public health as other types of pollution, light pollution has become a major environmental 23, increasing by approximately two percent a year between 2012 and 2016. Inappropriate or 24 use of artificial light is not only worsening our view of the universe, but it is also adversely impacting our environment, our health, and our energy consumption.

Wasteful light falling where it is not intended or needed is endangering 25 by harming animals whose life cycles depend on darkness. Many migratory birds fly at night, using natural light from the stars and the Moon to help them navigate. These birds become 26 by the glare of artificial light over urban areas. The American Bird Conservancy estimates that more than four million migratory birds die each year following collisions with brightly lit towers and buildings. In response to this, Canada has passed bird-friendly lighting and building laws, and now many cities, such as Toronto and New York, participate in lights-out campaigns during peak migration seasons. However, even outside of urban areas researchers have identified harmful impacts of light pollution on including bats, fish, turtles, and primates.

For humans, the change between night and day triggers biological cues that help us maintain regular sleeping patterns. Light pollution 28 with those cues, and this can affect our health by reducing the production of melatonin. Low melatonin levels are commonly 29 with heart disease, diabetes, depression, and cancer, particularly breast cancer. Furthermore, Dacher Keltner, a psychologist at the University of California, claims that the sense of wonder and 30 we feel when looking up at the stars at night can lead to people displaying better reasoning skills and more kindness.
